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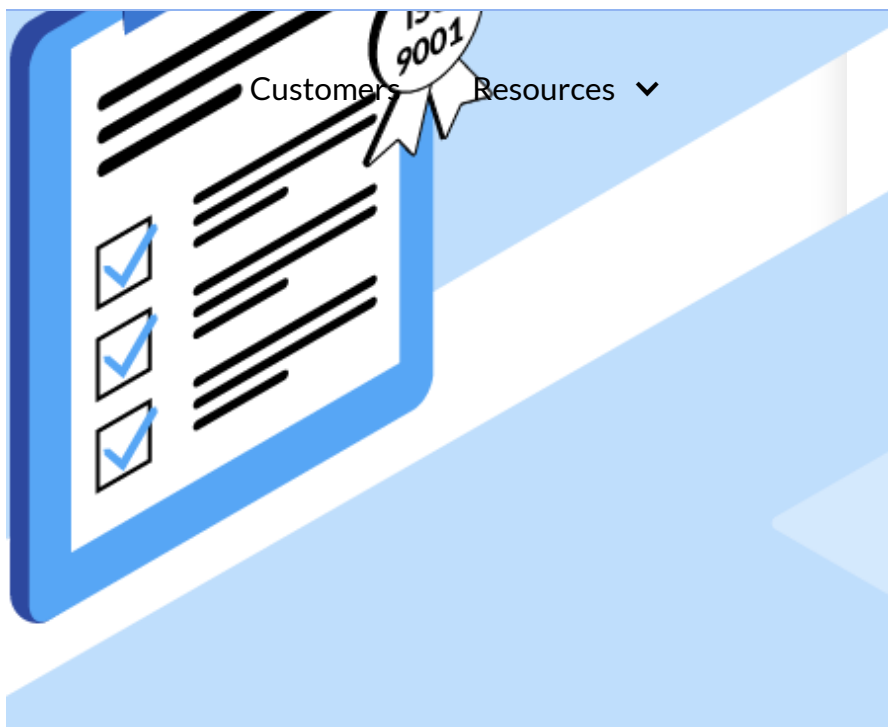
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## ISO 9001 Certification and Why

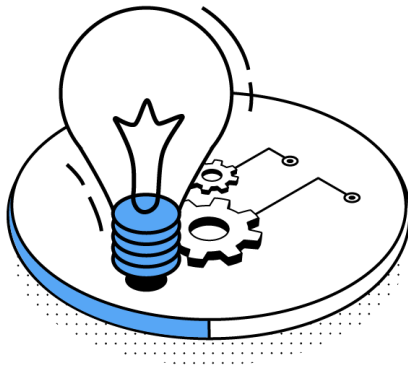

- **Product.** Steps necessary to provide the ultimate quality of products or services.
- **Measurement and improvement.** Mechanisms necessary to make the QMS always work as expected and regularly enhance it.

Apart from the structural changes, companies and organizations seeking compliance need detailed documentation. Without it, you won't prove that your entity follows quality management principles.
